

Project Director, International Programs College of Education

The College of Education (COE) at Auburn University seeks an innovative and energetic leader to coordinate international programs and activities in the college. The COE seeks to ensure that all graduates are prepared to be leaders in an increasingly diverse, global society. This will be accomplished through significant expansion of international programs to ensure that all COE graduates have an opportunity to engage in international activities prior to the completion of their degree.

The College seeks a collaborative and adaptive professional to promote and facilitate the development of new international programs and the expansion of current international programs such as student and faculty exchanges, service learning opportunities, degree collaborations and joint degree programs, as well as international research.

Position Description: This position is a 12-month, Non-tenure track faculty position in the College of Education. The Project Director will be responsible for helping the College to reach its strategic goals of growing international activities in locations throughout the world. This person will assist faculty and administrators in identifying new potential partnerships, seeking funding sources and writing grants to support international initiatives, coordinating interdisciplinary collaborations for international experiences, and marketing and promoting international opportunities. The project director may teach classes to support program endeavors, on a limited basis. The Project Director will report to the Associate Dean for Administration, Research and Innovative Programs.

Minimum Qualifications: (1) Masters degree from an accredited institution in an education related or international studies field, (2) experiences as a student and/or as a faculty member studying or working abroad (3) experience with government and university policies regarding international programs, (4) excellent interpersonal and communication skills, (5) demonstrated commitment to educational and cultural needs of diverse populations, (6) must meet eligibility requirements to work in the U.S. at the time appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for proposed term of employment, and (7) ability to communicate effectively in English .

Desired Qualifications: (1) Doctoral degree in education related or international studies field (2) successful grant writing experience, and (3) fluency in at least one foreign language.

Salary: Competitive. Commensurate with experience and qualifications.
